Developmental Delay

Children's Special Health Parent's Sheet

Description

Significant developmental delay is characterized by performance 2 standard deviations below the mean performance in any one category on Denver Developmental Scale. Global Developmental Delay is having performance 2 standard deviations below the mean performance level in more than two categories of gross/fine motor, speech cognition, social/personal, and activities for daily living. This category is usually reserved for children less than 5 years old; the term 'mental retardation' is applied to older children, when mental retardation is quantifiable with IQ testing in addition to performance levels in the areas mentioned above. A child under the age of 18 must have an IQ \leq 75 and deficits in at least 2 of the adaptive behavior domains indicated in the definition to obtain a diagnosis of mental retardation.

What services will CSH cover?

- Only **providers** listed on the Eligibility Letter will be paid
- Labs/Tests must be performed by a Wyoming Medicaid provider
- Well Child Checks (coverage limited to Pediatrician) according to AAP Periodicity Schedule
- Medications

Minimum requirements for coverage to continue with CSH:

- Compliance of medical care and care coordination
- Annual review with Public Health Nurse, financial eligibility
- Please keep your Public Health Nurse informed of any changes throughout the year for example: address, provider, diagnosis and/or insurance coverage
- Keep in contact with the local Public Health Office for additional requirements
