## **DART Chart Outbound Data Structure to WY MMIS**

The purpose of this document is to outline the outbound data structure from DART Chart to WY MMIS.

- 1. DART Chart will send a daily file containing changes to Resident Hold Status
- This file will transmit out from DART to WY MMIS sometime after Midnight before 8AM US Central Time the following morning
- 3. This file is a comma separated flat file, the value for each field will be within double quotes ("")
- 4. This file is ONE file containing information for all Facilities (SNFs) in the State of WY
- 5. The file contains unique records the uniqueness is enforced by a combination of the following fields
  - a. A resident
  - b. A provider
  - c. A specific entry date and
  - d. A start hold date
- 6. The file contains ONLY records of changes DART will NOT be necessarily sending a record for each resident in each facility, unless something has changed
- 7. A change is defined as any one of the following events. The type of change will be indicated in the record in one of the fields called Transaction Type. Full Record format is discussed later in this document.
  - a. TC01 Start Hold
  - b. TC02 Start Hold Date Change
  - c. TC03 End Hold
  - d. TC04 End Hold Date Change
  - e. TC05 Date of Entry Change
  - f. TC06 Discharge Date Change
  - g. TC90 Resident Delete
  - h. TC91 Transaction Delete
- 8. The format of each record being sent will include the following segments and fields
  - a. Facility Identification Information
    - i. National Provider Number (NPI)
    - ii. State Provider Number

- iii. FAC\_ID
- b. Resident Identification Information (This information will help crosswalk to the recipient ID on WY side).
  - i. First Name
  - ii. Last Name
  - iii. Gender
  - iv. Birth Date
  - v. SSN
  - vi. Medicare Number
  - vii. Medicaid Number
  - viii. Resident\_DART\_ID (Unique identifier created on DART this will be used as the key in DART to update any of the other identification information)
- c. Stay Information
  - i. Entry Date
  - ii. Discharge Date
- d. Hold Status Information
  - i. Hold Start Date
  - ii. Hold End Date
- e. Transaction Information
  - i. TransactionID A key generated on the DART side
  - ii. TransactionDate the date the transaction is being created and sent
  - iii. TransactionType Any of the change events mentioned in Point #7 above (the TC codes and the type of transaction)
- 9. Based on the TransactionType, WY will have to INSERT, UPDATE or DELETE records in their tables storing Hold Status for residents.

10. The date a hold file is sent over for a resident will be the date that will start the resident in a holding pattern from being billed to Medicaid. This resident will remain on hold every day until a stop hold file is sent. The date indicated that the hold has stopped will be the starting date for Medicaid to be paid. Any claim for a resident on a date range within the holding pattern will be denied for that date range.
