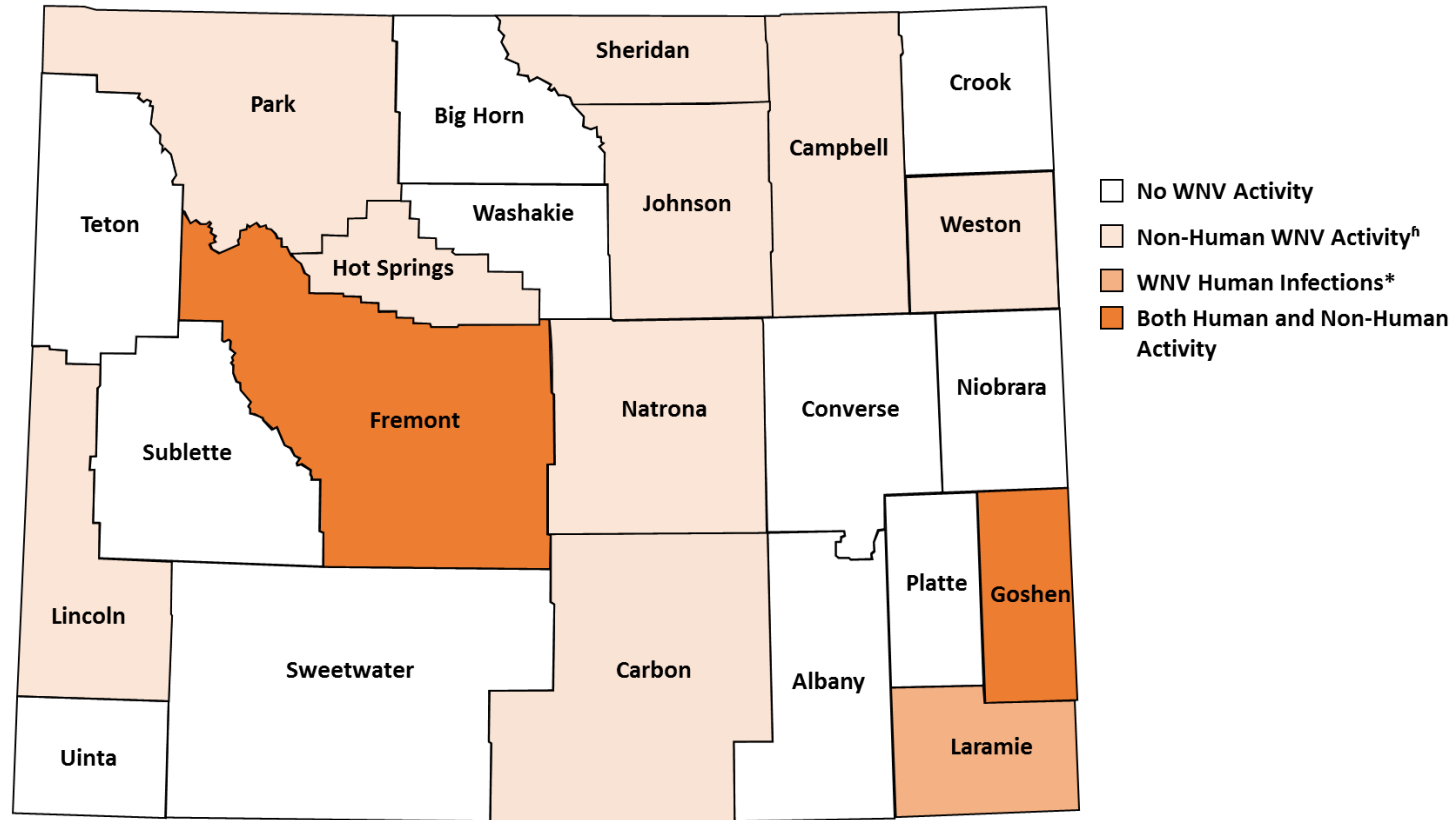
Counties not listed did not report any West Nile virus activity or surveillance activities.
