


Women Health Facts




Over the last six years (2004-2009) girls account for 49% all live births. There are 95 females born to every 100 males. The average age of a mother who has a new baby is 26. In 2009, 75% of babies were breastfed, 22% of mothers smoked during pregnancy, and 34% of mothers were not married. Thirty nine percent are first time moms!



The average age of a female getting married in Wyoming is 27. In divorce proceedings, wives files for divorce 61% of the time; they receive sole custody 53% of the time.

Over the last six years (2004-2009) women have been outliving men by 7 years (using the median 79 for females vs. 72 for males). Also a female has been the oldest living decedent every year during this time. In 2008, the oldest living female was 109, the highest in the six year span.

The following show the differences between Wyoming and U. S. cause of deaths for women during 2006:

Cancer is the leading cause of deaths for women in Wyoming for 2006. The five leading types of cancer that cause death in women are listed below:

- 1) Trachea bronchus and lung cancer: 23.8%
- 2) Breast cancer: 15.5%
- 3) Cervix uteri, corpus uteri, and ovary cancer: 9.2%
- 4) Colon, Rectum, and Anus cancer: 8.1%
- 5) Pancreas cancer: 5.8%
