VITAL STATISTICS

WYOMING STATE BOARD OF HEALTH

The Division of Vital Statistics is a division by statute. This division keeps on record in the State Department of Health all births occurring within the state and keeps a record of nativity, sex, cause, domestic condition, race and so that the relation of same to birth and available for Wyoming statistics.

Every certificate received is reported, indexed and filed and a transcript of same is made for the United States Government. Every mother to whom a birth is reported by the attending physician giving postoffice address, receives from the State Department of Health a certificate of registration of the birth of her child containing the child's name, date of birth, sex, place of birth, name, mother's maiden name and attending physician. The information is given us on the birth certificate on a full time basis consists of the State Health one clerk and one stenographer.

The question often arises, Why register deaths? in answer to which it may be said that hardly a relation in life, social, legal, or economic evidence furnished by an accurate registration may not prove to be of the greatest value, not only to the individual but also to the public at large. It is an act of civilization to register birth certificates, business, for they are frequently used in many ways:

- (1) As evidence to prove the age and legal heirs;
- (2) As proof of age to determine the value of a contract entered into by an alleged minor;
- (3) As evidence to establish age and proof of descent in order to vote;
- (4) As evidence to establish the right of inheritance to the professions and to many public offices;
- (5) As evidence of legal age to marry;
- (6) As evidence to prove the claim of widows and orphans under the widows' and orphans' Pension Act;
- (7) As evidence to determine the liability of a minor child;
- (8) As evidence in the administration of estates and settlements of insurance and pensions;
