Supplemental Questionnaire for TB Nucleic Acid Amplification Testing (NAAT)

The Centers for Disease Control recommends all patients suspected of a TB infection have a NAAT (Nucleic Acid Amplification Test), so a diagnosis can be obtained within a few days, rather than the 1-2 weeks required for culture confirmation. To improve the test's positive predictive value (PPV) by testing only patients that are highly suspected of having TB, we are asking for specific patient information. Answering the questions below will help determine if the patient should have this additional testing performed.
