When implemented properly, the CAA should help staff:

- Consider each resident as a whole, with unique characteristics and strengths that affect his/her capacity to function
- Identify areas of concern that may warrant interventions
- Develop, to the extent possible, interventions to help improve, stabilize or prevent decline in physical, functional and psychological wellbeing in the context of the resident's condition, choices and preferences for interventions
- Address the need and desire for other important considerations such as advanced care planning and palliative care, e.g., symptom relief and pain management
