Professional Level Training in Suicide Treatment Assessing and Managing Suicide Risk

Core competencies for Mental Health Professionals AMSR is one-day training for mental health professionals that focuses on knowledge and attitudes, using skill demonstrations, discussions, and journaling through the course.

At-Risk in Primary Care

This is a CME-approved online training simulation designed to prepare primary care providers to screen patients for mental health and substance abuse disorders, perform brief interventions using motivational interviewing techniques, and refer patients to treatment. In this simulation, PCP's interact with two virtual patients in order to learn the practical and tangible techniques to efficiently and effectively screen and manage the treatment of patients with some of the most common mental health disorders. At-Risk in the ED

This is a CME-approved online training simulation that prepares emergency department personnel to screen patients for mental health and substance abuse disorders, perform brief interventions using motivational interviewing techniques, and refer patients to treatment. The learning experience is structured around a series of clinical scenarios where users engage in role-play practice conversations with virtual patients, using evidence-based screening tools. Counseling on Access to Lethal Means (CALM)

This online course is designed for providers who counsel people at risk for suicide, primarily mental health and medical providers, but also clergy and social service providers. The first module explains why reducing access to lethal methods of self-harm saves lives. The second module teaches practical skills on when and how to ask suicidal clients about their access to lethal means and how to work with them and their families to reduce their access. Intervention Level Training in Suicide Recognition and Response

School Suicide Prevention Accreditation Program

For school psychologists, social workers, counselors, nurses, and all others dedicated to or responsible for reducing the incidence of suicide and suicidal behaviors among today's school-age youth. Online certification course:

Applied Suicide Intervention Skills Training (ASIST)

ASIST is a two-day (15 hours) intensive, interactive and practice-dominated course designed to help caregivers recognize risk and learn how to prevent the immediate risk of suicide. Just as "CPR" skills make physical first aid possible, training in suicide intervention develops the skills needed for suicide first aid. Crisis Intervention Teams (CIT)

These programs promote and support collaborative efforts to create and sustain more effective interactions among law enforcement, mental health care providers, individuals with mental illness, their families and communities and also reduce the stigma of mental illness. Mental Health First Aid (MHFA)

MHFA is an eight hour in-person training that teaches you how to help persons developing a mental illness or in crisis. For more information, visit www.mentalhealthfirstaid.org/cs/

Youth Mental Health First Aid

Youth Mental Health First Aid is an 8 hour in-person workshop primarily designed for adults who regularly interact with young people, ages 12-18. The course introduces common mental health challenges for youth, reviews typical adolescent development, and teaches a 5-step action plan for how to help young people in both crisis and non-crisis situations. Topics covered include anxiety, depression, substance use, disorders in which psychosis may occur, disruptive behavior disorders (including AD/HD), and eating disorders. Sources of Strength

Sources of Strength, a universal suicide prevention school-based program, is designed to build socio-ecological protective influences among youth to reduce the likelihood

Public Level Education

safeTALK

safeTalk, about three hours in duration, is a training that prepares anyone over the age of 15 to identify persons with thoughts of suicide and connect them to suicide first aid resources. Most people with thoughts of suicide invite help to stay safe. Alert helpers know how to use these opportunities to support that desire for safety. For more information, visit www.livingworks.net

Operation S.A.V.E.: VA Suicide Prevention Gatekeeper Training

Operation S.A.V.E is a one- to- two-hour gatekeeper training program provided by VA suicide prevention coordinators to veterans and those who serve veterans. Optional role-playing exercises are included. Components of the S.A.V.E model are: Signs of Suicide, Asking about suicide, Validating feelings, Encouraging help and Expediting treatment. Question, Persuade, Refer (QPR)

QPR stands for Question, Persuade, Refer, three steps anyone can learn to help prevent suicide. QPR is a 1-2 hour training.
