EVV– What and Why

- Electronic Visit Verification (EVV) is a technology that tracks where and when a client receives services.
- This data is collected through a variety of technologies, one or many of which may be offered by an EVV vendor
- Some examples of technologies include:
 - Mobile Application for download
 - Dedicated Hand-held Devices
 - Interactive Voice Recognition
 - One-Time Password Generation Machines

EVV– What and Why

- On December 13, 2016, Congress signed the 21st Century Cures Act into law.
- Section 12006 requires Electronic Visit Verification for Medicaid services.
- Implementation Deadline for states is January 1, 2019 to cover Personal Care Services providers.

EVV – What and Why

- States are required to collect the following to verify services:
 - 1) Service Type
 - 2) Individual Receiving Service
 - 3) Date of Service
 - 4) Location of Service Delivery
 - 5) Individual Providing Service
 - 6) Begin and End times of Service

EVV– What and Why

- Five Options for Implementation Models
 - Provider Choice
 - MCO Choice (Not an option in Wyoming)
 - State-Mandated External Vendor
 - State-Mandated In-House System
 - Open Vendor

State of Wyoming Approach
