Instructions for Public Medication Donations

What Can Be Donated:

- ✓ Sealed packaging
- ✓ In date (5+ months before expiration)

What We Do NOT Accept:

- □ Opened
- □ Expired medications (less than 5 months before expiration)
- □ Controlled substances (e.g. medications for pain, anxiety, sleep, ADHD)
- □ Refrigerated medicine
- Medical Supplies
- Insulin syringes
- Empty Bottles
- Veterinary medicine

How to Donate:

Step 1. Collect acceptable medication. Remove or mark out patient identifying information (name, address, phone number, and prescription number). Leave the drug name and expiration date on the container. **Step 2.** Complete a Public Medication Donation Form with the following information as completely as possible:

- 1) Drug name & strength
- 2) Quantity donated
- 3) Expiration date

4) NDC number- This is the National Drug Code. Each drug has its own NDC number. The NDC consists of 11 numbers. The format is 12345-1234-01. The number can typically be found near the bottom of the prescription label, by a bar code, or at the top of the front face of a medication that is in the original box.

- 5) Manufacturer
- 6) WMDP Staff Use- Leave this box blank

<u>Step 3.</u> Donate at your local Donation Site. Visit our website or text [county name] to (307) 370-2086 to find a location.

<u>Step 4.</u> If mailing the donation and you would like delivery confirmation, use a delivery confirmation method via USPS, UPS or FedEx. For the safety of the Medication Donation Program staff, the box must not be larger than 18" x 18" x 18" and must not be heavier than 25 pounds.

The Wyoming Medication Donation Program does <u>NOT</u> provide tax receipts for individual donors
