## **GUIDELINES**

## IF YOU HAVE INSURANCE

- You will need to <u>REPORT ALL INSURANCE POLICIES TO THE DOCTOR OR HOSPITAL.</u> MHR/NBIC expects any hospital and/or medical insurance benefits that you receive TO <u>BE PAID TOWARD</u> the cost of you or your child's medical care before benefits are applied.
- Ask your provider to bill your insurance directly and/or assign benefits to your provider. This means your insurance company will pay directly to your provider.

## **PAYMENT PROCEDURES**

Upon receipt of your eligibility letter, notify your approved providers of the following billing process:

- Your healthcare provider's office will electronically submit the bill to Conduent (Wyoming Medicaid), the agency that pays MHR/NBIC bills. If you receive a bill, notify the provider to submit the claim to Conduent. The telephone number for Conduent is 1-800-251-1268 (clients 1269).
- Payment for services is dependent upon enrollment with Wyoming Medicaid by your approved provider(s).
- There are financial caps for each program:
  - o MHR Maternal care by a Level III provider is limited to a \$5,000 per case cap to include travel assistance and \$5,500 for air ambulance transport.
    - "Normal" Newborn Level III infant care is limited to \$3,000 per case cap to include travel assistance.
  - NBIC Level III infant care is limited to a \$40,000 per case cap to include air ambulance transport and travel assistance.
- You may receive <u>monthly statements</u> of your account until it is paid. Please contact your Public Health Nurse if you do get a request for payment for MHR/NBIC authorized services.
- CSH is not responsible for payment over the financial cap, for care provided before eligibility date or for care to a non-covered providers.
