Wyoming Office of Rural Health Updates

What is the Wyoming Office of Rural Health (ORH)?:

The WY-ORH is a program within the Wyoming Department of Health, Public Health Divsion, that seeks to enhance access to healthcare services, support the development of an adequate healthcare workforce, and promote collaboration in expanding comprehensive, community-based healthcare in rural Wyoming. The WY-ORH houses the Wyoming Primary Care Office, the Wyoming Medicare Rural Hospital Flexibility (Flex) Program, the Small Rural Hospital Improvement Program (SHIP). Additionally, WY-ORH provides funding and support for the Wyoming Telehealth Network, the Wyoming Telehealth Consortium, and the Research and Explore Awesome Careers in Healthcare (REACH) Program, and provides technical assistance for a variety of activities including grant writing, provider recruitment, and community assessment development. ORH receives new HRSA grant!

The WY-ORH was one of three states recently awarded the Rural Veterans Health Access Program (RVHAP) Grant through the Federal Office of Rural Health Policy. The RVHAP Grant is a three year project with the goal of increasing access to quality healthcare services for rural veterans, particularly mental health services via telehealth technology. ORH staff are excited to begin work on this new project!

Rural Health Network Development Planning Program

This funding opportunity is offered by the Health Resources and Services Administration (HRSA) and supports funding for a one year planning period for healthcare organizations who wish to form a healthcare network in order to deliver better, more efficient care to their communities. - Maximum Award: \$100,000

The Research and Explore Awesome Careers in Healthcare (REACH) Program is an exciting program supported by the WY-ORH focusing on rural students in grades 5-10. The purpose of the program is to increase students' awareness, interest, and understanding of healthcare careers available in rural Wyoming. Grant award recipients host day camps in a healthcare setting where students are introduced to rural healthcare careers through a variety of innovative activities.

- **Maximum Award**: \$1,490
- Eligible Applicants: rural healthcare organizations, rural schools or school districts, non profit organizations, and other other organizations per ORH approval.
- Project Period: August 2019-June 2020
- Application Deadline: January 31, 2020 or until all awards are distributed
