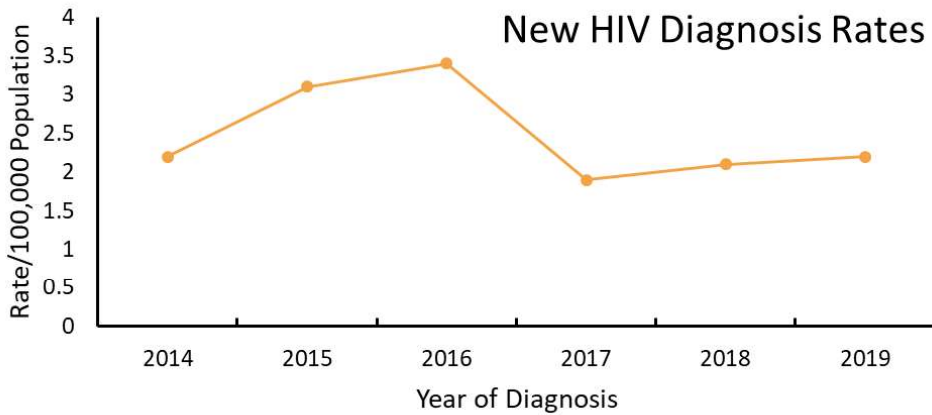
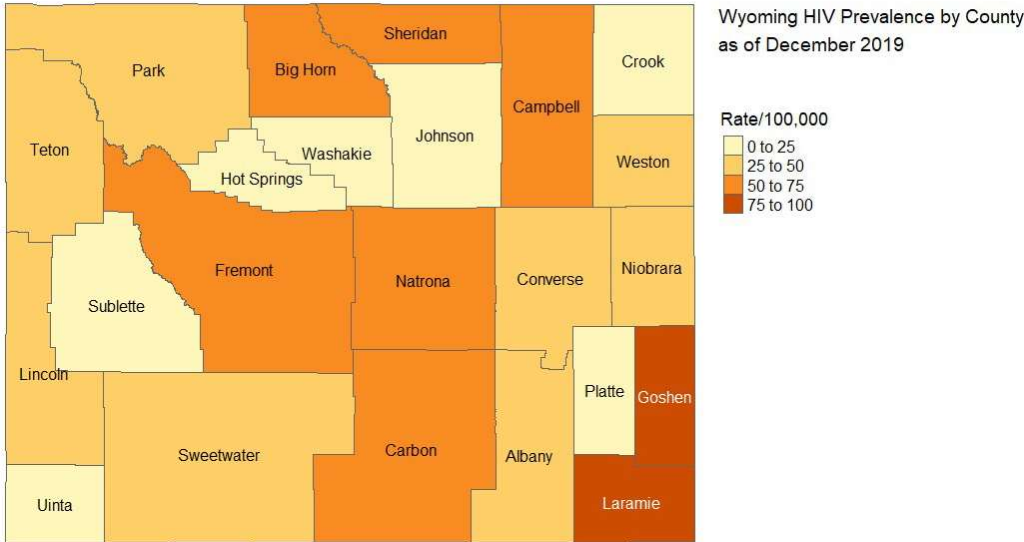

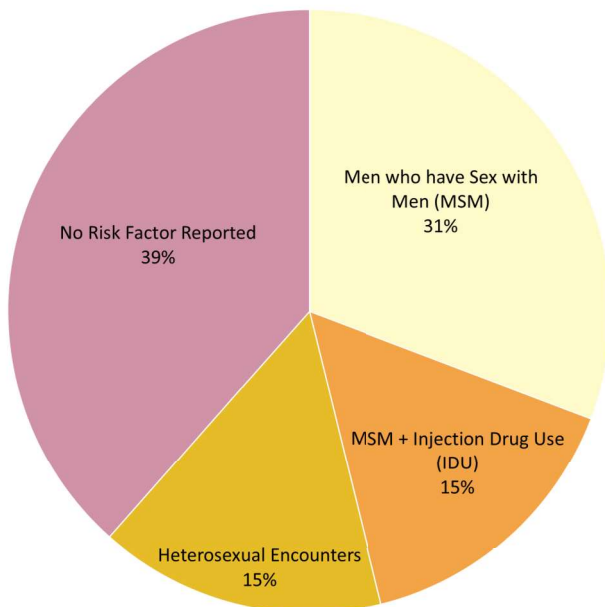

HIV, or Human Immunodeficiency Virus, is the virus that can lead to AIDS (Acquired Immunodeficiency Syndrome) - now called HIV Stage 3. HIV is transmitted through unprotected sex, blood to blood contact, and mother to child through birth and breastfeeding.

Symptoms of HIV can include flu like symptoms, though many people do not experience any symptoms. The only way to know your status is to get tested. To find out how to get low- or no-cost testing, visit www.knowyo.org.



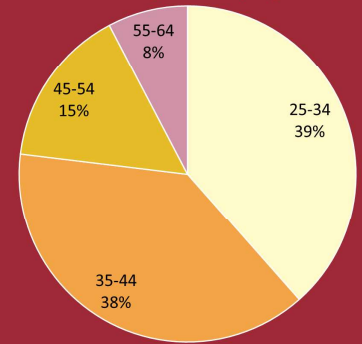
New HIV Diagnoses by Transmission Category 2014-2019

The approximate monthly dollar amount spent by the Communicable Disease Treatment Program to support medication, doctor's visits, laboratory testing, housing, and transportation for individuals infected with HIV.

New HIV Diagnoses by Age 2019



38% of new cases in 2019 were Hispanic or Latino

15.4% of newly reported infections in 2019 were diagnosed as HIV Stage 3 (AIDS)

This suggests that nearly one sixth of new diagnoses in 2019 were tested late and missed opportunities for prevention and treatment.
