# Syphilis



Syphilis outbreaks are occurring across the country including Wyoming's neighboring states. The outbreaks have included numerous cases of congenital syphilis. Untreated syphilis can cause major health issues including death in both patients and unborn children. Up to 40% of babies born to women with untreated syphilis may be stillborn, or die from the infection as a newborn. Congenital syphilis is preventable with appropriate testing and treatment. The Communicable Disease Unit encourages all providers to test for syphilis for every client based on risk as indicated in the Wyoming CDU Screening recommendations, which can be found on the CDU STD Health Professional Resources page.

It is imperative that syphilis testing is provided to all patients who are at risk and to all pregnant women when positive pregnancy status is determined. Repeat testing should be provided to pregnant women in accordance with the testing algorithm listed below and throughout the duration of the pregnancy, if any of the following apply to the patient or their partner(s):

- Patient or partner have other sexual partners
- Use of injection or intranasal drugs
- Unprofessional or homemade tattoo(s) or piercing(s). .

# Screening Recommendations for Pregnant Women and testing

algorithms can be found on the CDU STD Health Professional Resources page. Please feel free to distribute these resources to local providers.

Syphilis testing is covered through KnoWyo safety-net testing vouchers. If KnoWyo testing sites charge an administration fee, the fee should not exceed \$25.00 and patients requesting KnoWyo testing may not be turned away for inability to pay. At this time, we ask that KnoWyo sites waive testing administration fees for syphilis testing. If a KnoWyo site is unable to waive the testing administration fee, for a limited time, KnoWyo testing sites may invoice CDU for the administration fee for syphilis testing instead of passing that cost on to the patient. Sites may submit a monthly invoice for a maximum of \$25.00 per patient for each patient tested for syphilis.

Testing sites must submit a syphilis testing administration fee invoice to the CDU within 45 days of the date the patient was tested. Invoices received after the 45 days may not be paid.

### 340B



Monthly CDU 340B STD medication and TB serum, as well as EPT reporting is due by the 5th of every month. For clinics utilizing medications provide by CDU you must report either administration or none given each month. None given reporting can be completed between the last day of the month through the 5th of the following month. This reporting is a condition of 340B certification and is requested during federal 340B audits. We will be unable to recertify clinics that are not compliant with the reporting requirements.



Please remember to advise clients with positive (gonorrhea, syphilis, hepatitis B or C, and HIV) tests that DIS may be calling to touch base with them for follow-up.

#### TB



TB Case Manager: The clinic staff member who manages the case for patient's with positive TB results. Clinics include Public Health, UW SHS, FQHCs, Corrections, Private Provider, etc.

Prior Authorizations: Please send a copy of the PA to the billing department of the facility who will be performing the service(s) before the service is provided.

Close-out reminder: TB Case Managers please remind facilities the 2021 TB Grant closes December 31, 2021. In order for the facility to receive payment, all billing for 2021 TB Program services (prior authorizations) must be correctly submitted to the CDU TB Program by December 31, 2021.

**HIV Peer Support Navigation** 





People Living with HIV (PLWH) have a first-hand understanding of the HIV services that are available in Wyoming, and are able to serve as an excellent resource for individuals who have been newly diagnosed or someone who is struggling with any aspect of an HIV diagnosis. HIV Peer Support Navigators are HIV positive individuals or parent/guardian of HIV+ children, with special training and a willingness to provide HIV navigation support to others living with HIV. Peers are able to provide guidance and advocacy that is intended to supplement the education and information provided by medical case managers and clinicians.

HIV Peer Support Navigation is for anyone in Wyoming who is living with HIV.

# **HIV/TB Prior Authorization Form**

	PRIOR AUTHORIZATION	

The prior authorization form for the CDU HIV and TB Treatment Programs has been updated. It is now two-sided with the form on one side (HIV on the top half, TB on the bottom half) and billing instructions on the other side. Please note the date of 10/15/2021 in the bottom right hand corner.

Please ensure the billing department of the facility providing the prior authorized service receives a copy of the prior authorization before the patient receives the service. Also, please educate the patient that the facility will need to bill according to the



prior authorization instructions.
