
## Syphilis in Wyoming

Syphilis is a bacterial infection spread through unprotected oral, anal, and vaginal sex. The Wyoming Department of Health (WDH) recommends syphilis screening for all sexually active individuals. Also, WDH recommends repeated syphilis testing on pregnant persons throughout pregnancy if the pregnant person or partners: have other sexual partners, use injection or intranasal drugs, or have unprofessional tattoos or piercings.

## **2021 Cases**

During 2021, there were **43** cases of syphilis reported.






## **Diagnosis**


Only **37.2%** of cases were diagnosed with **primary** or **secondary syphilis.** Therefore, 62.8% of cases could have been diagnosed sooner.

Over two-fifths (41.4%) of male

cases reported sex with other males (MSM) as a risk factor.



represented the largest portion of reported cases, followed by the **35-44 age group**.



## **Symptoms**

Syphilis has **multiple stages of infection** that are defined by the presence or absence of certain symptoms. Common symptoms include painless sores (primary syphilis) and rash, hair loss, swollen lymph nodes, or mucous patches (secondary syphilis).
