# Wyoming Department of Health Reportable Diseases and Conditions

A report is required by law (State Statute § 35-4-107) from **both the attending healthcare provider/hospital and the laboratory performing diagnostic testing.**

Wyoming laboratories are responsible for reporting results when a reference laboratory is used.

## DISEASES IN RED: Immediate Notification at 1-888-996-9104

**Diseases in Black:** Reportable within **24 hours** of diagnosis by fax/telephone/ELR

**Diseases in Green:** Reportable within **7 days of diagnosis by fax/phone/mail/ELR**

**LAB:** In addition to reporting, **submit an isolate or other appropriate material**, in accordance with IATA Dangerous Goods Regulations to: State Public Health Laboratory, Combined Laboratories Facility, 208 S College Dr., Cheyenne, WY 82002

  - Hepatitis B, all HBV DNA tests regardless of result (Electronic Lab Reporting Only)
  - \*Hepatitis C, including all test results of an infant born to a positive mother\*
  - Hepatitis C, all HCV RNA tests regardless of result (Electronic Lab Reporting Only)
  - HIV, positive/reactive detection tests
  - HIV/AIDS, all CD4s, all viral loads, all genotype results, all previous test results (regardless of result) for newly diagnosed cases, and all perinatal exposures
  - Influenza, hospital/reference electronic lab reporting only
