Maternal and Child Health Unit Highlights

- Established a unit-wide strategy <u>snapshot</u> (encompasses Title V and other MCH priorities) and continued action our priorities
- Participated in regional Tribal engagement community of practice and division-led efforts to strengthen relationships with Tribal nations
- Began participating in a national family engagement coaching and community of practice
- Supporting Medicaid with sharing information about "unwinding" efforts
- Began building out communication tools and resources to improve branding and public engagement
- Will begin planning for the next Title V Needs Assessment (which will guide 2026-2030 priorities)
