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History

- Congress passes the Breast and Cervical Cancer Mortality Prevention Act of 1990
- CDC Created the National Breast and Cervical Cancer Early Detection Program (NBCCEDP) in 1991
- Wyoming Breast and Cervical Cancer Early Detection Program (WBCCEDP) was established in 1997 and is now in its 26th year
- Congress passes the Breast and Cervical Cancer Prevention and Treatment Act 2000



Purpose

- NBCCEDP helps those with low incomes
- Timely breast and cervical cancer screening
- Provides patient navigation services
- Treatment Services



WCP Referrals Require

- Current completed WCP application
- Pathology Report
- Moving to Wyoming and currently being treated
- Notification of Cancer Diagnosis Immediately to WCP

All clients will be referred to LIV Health for additional support



Medicaid Eligibility Requirements

- Active in Wyoming Breast and Cervical Cancer Program
- U.S. Citizenship / Immigration Status
- Wyoming Residency
- No Insurance Coverage, Including Medicare
- Proof of income



Income Guidelines

Gross monthly family income limit is 250% of the Federal Poverty Level

Medicaid

- 48 to 72 hour for outreach call
- Assistance with Completion of application
- Send copy of all required documents



Approval

- Usually less than 2 week
- All Medicaid questions can be answered by calling Medicaid Customer Service directly at 1-855-294-2127



Denied for Medicaid

- LIV Health
 - 211
 - Foundation in area
 - Other resources available
- Client will remain in the Breast and Cervical program for screening
Will not cover treatment services
