

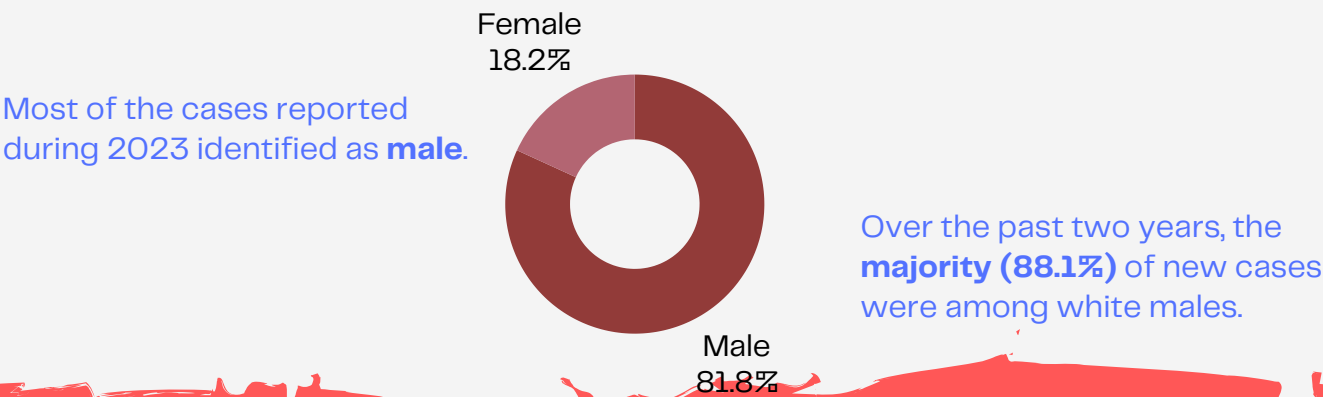

HIV in Wyoming

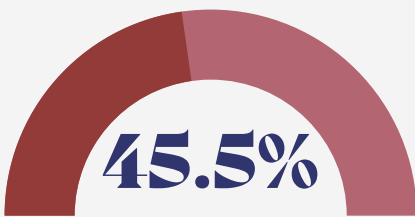
Human Immunodeficiency Virus (HIV) is the virus that can lead to AIDS (Acquired Immunodeficiency Syndrome) – now called HIV Stage 3. HIV is transmitted through condomless sex, blood-to-blood contact, and mother-to-child through birth and breastfeeding. According to the CDC, about one in ten new HIV diagnoses are attributed to injection drug use (IDU) or men who have sex with men (MSM) and IDU (men who report both risk factors).

2023 Cases

During 2023, there were **22** cases of HIV reported.

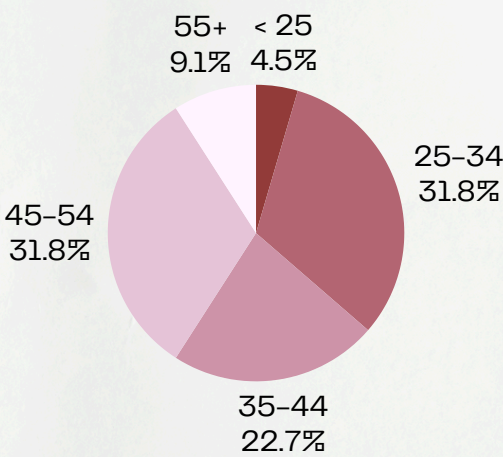


HIV Stage 3 (AIDS)



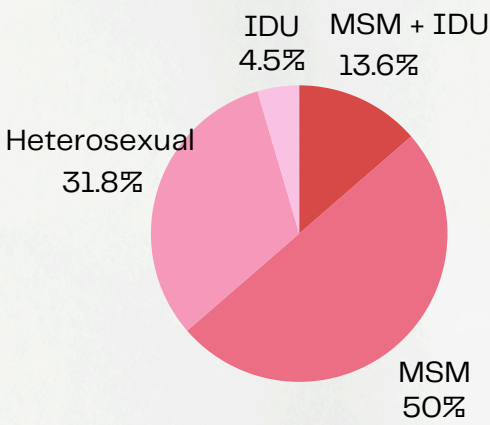
In 2023, a large percentage (**45.5%**) of newly diagnosed HIV cases were diagnosed as **HIV Stage 3 (AIDS)**. This is an increase from 2022 data when less than ten percent of the cases were diagnosed with HIV Stage 3.

Cases by Age-group

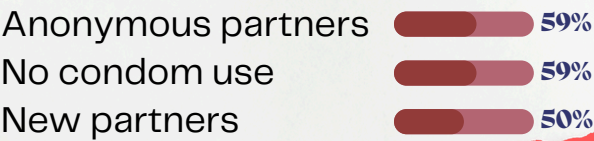


In 2023, the **25-34 and 45-54 age groups** represented the largest portion of reported cases.

Commonly Reported Risk Factors

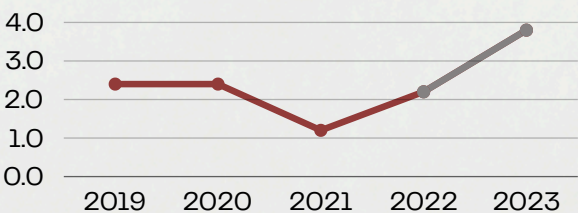


Symptoms

New HIV Diagnosis Rates

The HIV rate **increased** during 2023; the increased rate surpassed previous levels before the decrease in 2021.

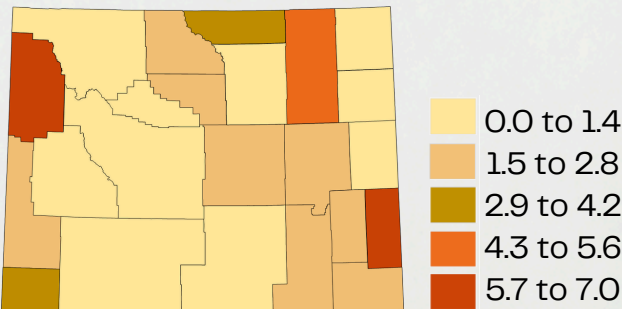
