A report is required by law (State Statute § 35-4-107) from **both** the **attending healthcare provider/hospital** and the laboratory performing diagnostic testing.

Wyoming laboratories are responsible for reporting results when a reference laboratory is used.

Hemolytic Uremic Syndrome Hepatitis A, D, E

Hepatitis B, including all test results of an infant born to a positive mother

Hepatitis B, all HBV DNA tests regardless of result (Electronic Lab Reporting Only)

Hepatitis C, including all test results of an infant born to a positive mother

Hepatitis C, all HCV RNA tests regardless of result (Electronic Lab Reporting Only)

HIV, positive/reactive detection tests

HIV/AIDS, all CD4s, all viral loads, all genotype results, all previous test results (regardless of result) for newly diagnosed cases, and all perinatal exposures

Influenza, hospital/reference electronic lab reporting only
