Jamie Beastrom: Family service coordinator - Newcastle -

- Region III Developmental Services is working on our May one count and will be transitioning roughly 40 children to kindergarten in all 5 of our communities.
- Participating in the Adventures in Learning night with our community agencies to celebrate Week of the Young Child. Families have opportunities to visit each agency for an engaging activity and when they have completed all areas, each child can choose a book to take home.

Natalie Terrell: Region 13 -

- Celebrating NAEYC Week of the Young Child this week. Kicked the week off with a family carnival night and celebrated during the week with fun classroom events.
- We will have our first annual "Summer Camp" sessions starting this June. Camps will be offered to community children ages 3-8 and will run two weeks in June and two weeks in July. Some of the sessions include "STEAM", "Outdoor adventure", "Messy Picasso Art camp", "Literacy Camp". ESY services will be offered during the camp for those it was recommended.

Kelley Shepp: Wyoming Dept of Insurance - No updates to report

Kim Caylor: EIEP Unit Manager -

- Preschool has made great improvements over the past year in regard to the Compliance Agreement under WDE.
- Encouraged the CDC's to register for the ESA process.
- Both Part B and C staff will attend in-person COS trainings.

Jennifer Petri: Part B / 619 Coordinator -

 The Part B Parent Survey results are far above the national average, with a 98 percent satisfaction rating and a 45 % participation rate.



- Indicators of quality, including improvements in children's social-emotional skills, knowledge, and taking action to meet needs remain above the national average.
- The least restrictive environment percentages remain excellent, with Wyoming continuing to be second only to one other state. This means that the vast majority of our students with disabilities are educated in a regular education environment.

Ragen Latham: Operations & Projects Administrator / Interim Senior Administrator - Introduced Suzy Wagner - Data Driven

Helena Wagner: Head Start

- The Office of Head Start does not currently have a politically appointed director. However, the administration's priorities will likely emphasize the MAHA (Make America Healthy Again) initiatives from Secretary Kennedy.
- The HSCO is reviving resources and materials to support nutrition and wellness in all ECE settings, and will be expanding initiatives to support healthy habits at home. The <u>Healthy Policies Toolkit</u> was well-received when launched in 2019 and may be revised for re-release to all Wyoming programs. An addendum would focus on home-visiting programs and persistently challenging areas such as negotiating CACFP-approved snack-time.
- Partnership Update:
 - o Initiatives hosted by WDE, such as Get Wild Wyoming.
 - Wyoming Oral Health Coalition to ensure toothbrushing resources (for all ages) are readily available through ECE program partnerships.
 - Head Start programs at the local level are actively connected to the First Lady's Hunger Initiative that links local food providers and commodities to families most in need.

Bradley Hartman Bakken / Sarah Fitzgerald: EHDI

- Continuing work to ensure access to newborn hearing screenings for the out of hospital/community birth population by providing equipment and training to licensed and certified nurse midwives. EHDI and the Newborn Screening Program are presenting information during the Wyoming State Board of Midwifery on April 10, 2025. This population has increased from 2.4% of Wyoming births in 2020 to 4% in 2024.
- Continuing to partner with the CDC in Casper to provide a pediatric audiology specialty clinic for children birth through 21. For children 5 and under, family-to-family support is an integrated component of the audiology appointments.
- The Wyoming Early Intervention Initiative (WEII) is continuing to provide support to the WEII Plus Facilitators. Facilitators are typically speech language pathologists and Teachers of the Deaf at the CDCs providing early intervention to children who are Deaf/hard of hearing (D/HH) and their families. A virtual, collaborative training with the Colorado School for the Deaf and the Blind,



Supporting the Whole Child: Social-Emotional, Sensory, and Self-regulation Skills for Children who are D/HH, is scheduled for Facilitators on May 17th. Ongoing uniform developmental assessments are continuing for this population. Since September of 2020, 217 assessments have been completed on 77 children who are D/HH, ages 9 months through 5 years of age.

- Working with the EIEP to have SPED Advantage and the EHDI-IS integrated so that hearing and vision screening results and follow-up will only need to be entered into one system, the EHDI-IS, as soon as this fall. Currently drafting a Data Use Agreement to make this possible.
- Hearing screening trainings are ongoing. To date in 2025, screeners in CDC Regions 1, 10, and 13 have received the training. CDC Regions 2 and 7 are scheduled for June and August, respectively, and EHDI can schedule others as needed/requested. Training on how to enter hearing and vision screening results and follow-up information in the EHDI-IS are also ongoing and can be scheduled as needed/requested. In 2025, this training has been provided to staff in Regions 10-13.

- If students enter using the BDI tool, they will exit using COS. Other states have changed systems and we know that the data will be messy for around 3 years, but we just need to be able to explain the process and where we are in the process for OSEP reporting.

DMS Monitoring - Part C -

- The Part C DMS Monitoring visit is scheduled to take place in October 2026. The monitoring will be conducted in three phases:
 - Phase 1: Document Request and Protocol Interviews
 - Phase 2: On-site/Virtual Visit through issuing of the Monitoring Report
 - Phase 3: Follow-up and Close-out
- The OSEP Monitoring team will request all policies, procedures, and process documents from the program, including backup documents showing the implementation of the policies/procedures.
- They will engage with the local programs, families, parent centers, EIC, and advocacy groups to gather information about the WY Part C program. We have been working really hard to prepare for the visit. We've started making updates to our Part C procedure documents. Kim and I attended an intense 2 ½ day work session with our contracted Technical Writer to go through our Part C policies and procedures and create manuals for program and fiscal monitoring, as well as dispute resolution. The next project is to work on creating desk manuals that further define the step-by step processes.

Part C Self Assessment Revision -

- The Part C annual self-assessment was revised to allow regional programs a structured opportunity to evaluate their performance and identify areas for improvement.
- The revised assessment protocol focuses on areas that impact program quality and compliance. Programs examine their timeliness for initial evaluations, service delivery, and IFSP development. They also evaluate their transition planning processes, ensuring that



families experience smooth transitions to the preschool program, other services or exiting from Part C. All Regions have completed their assessments, the next step is for EIEP to review results and work with programs to develop improvement plans that will guide improvement efforts throughout the coming year.
