



# Legislation



- Section 71401 of H.R. 1, the "One Big Beautiful Bill Act" (OBBA, P.L. 119-21)
  - Wyoming could receive \$500+ million over the next five years, if our application is approved.
  - Applications are due in early November.
- Purpose: Transform rural health care systems to make them more sustainable and improve people's health.
