


# HIV in Wyoming | 2024

Human Immunodeficiency Virus (HIV) is the virus that can lead to AIDS (Acquired Immunodeficiency Syndrome) - now called **HIV Stage 3**. HIV is transmitted through condomless sex, blood-to-blood contact, and mother-to-child through birth and breastfeeding. Symptoms of acute HIV can include influenza-like symptoms, though many people have **no symptoms**. Currently, HIV cannot be cured, but people with HIV can live longer, healthier lives with treatment.

The **25-44** age groups made up most of the reported HIV cases in Wyoming.  
Number of reported cases in 2024 by age group.




**Common risk factors** for HIV infection include anonymous partners, no condom use, and new partners. **Everyone aged 13-64** should get tested for HIV **at least once**, and more often with certain risk factors.


About one in ten new HIV diagnoses are attributed to injection drug use (IDU) or men who have sex with men (MSM) and IDU (men who report both risk factors).

The HIV incidence rate **decreased** during 2024. Nearly half of the newly diagnosed HIV cases were diagnosed as **HIV Stage 3**, indicating the diagnosis was late in the course of infection


The rates are per 100,000 population
