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# What is High Fidelity Wraparound?



**HIGH FIDELITY WRAPAROUND IS A PLANNING PROCESS THAT BRINGS PEOPLE TOGETHER FROM DIFFERENT AREAS OF A FAMILY'S LIFE TO FORM A TEAM. THE TEAM CREATES STEPS TO HELP YOUTH STAY IN THEIR HOMES, SCHOOLS AND COMMUNITIES.**

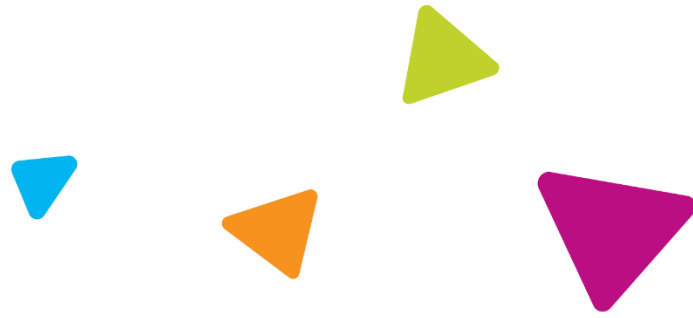
# Who is eligible for HFWA?

Children/youth may qualify for these services if he or she:

- is between the ages of 4 and 20
- is eligible for Medicaid
  - Non-Medicaid youth can access income-based waiver (*Waives parent's Income*).
- has been involved in multiple systems
- has received a specific behavioral/mental health diagnosis
- has social or emotional challenges that impact his/her life
- not currently being served through any other Medicaid waiver
- is on the Developmental Disabilities Waiver waitlist and meets all of the previously mentioned criteria



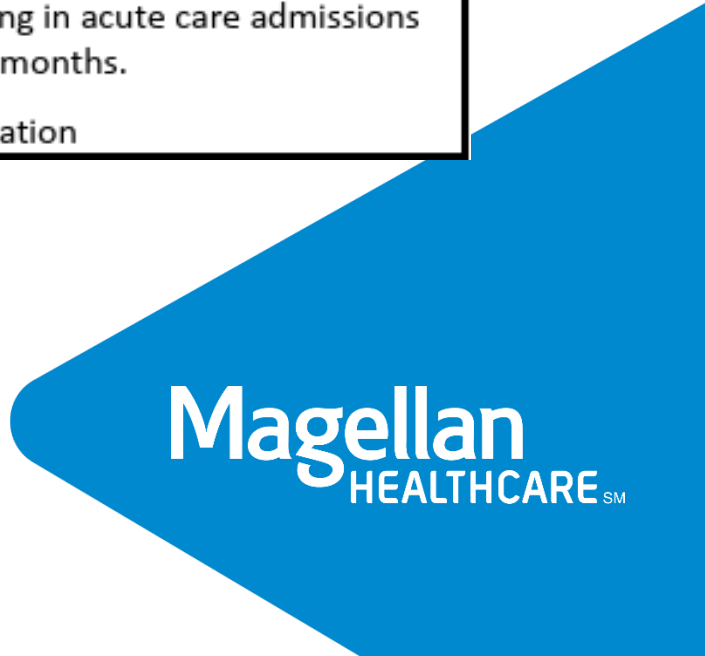
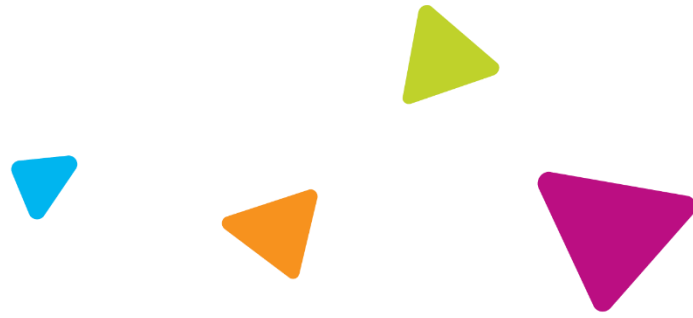

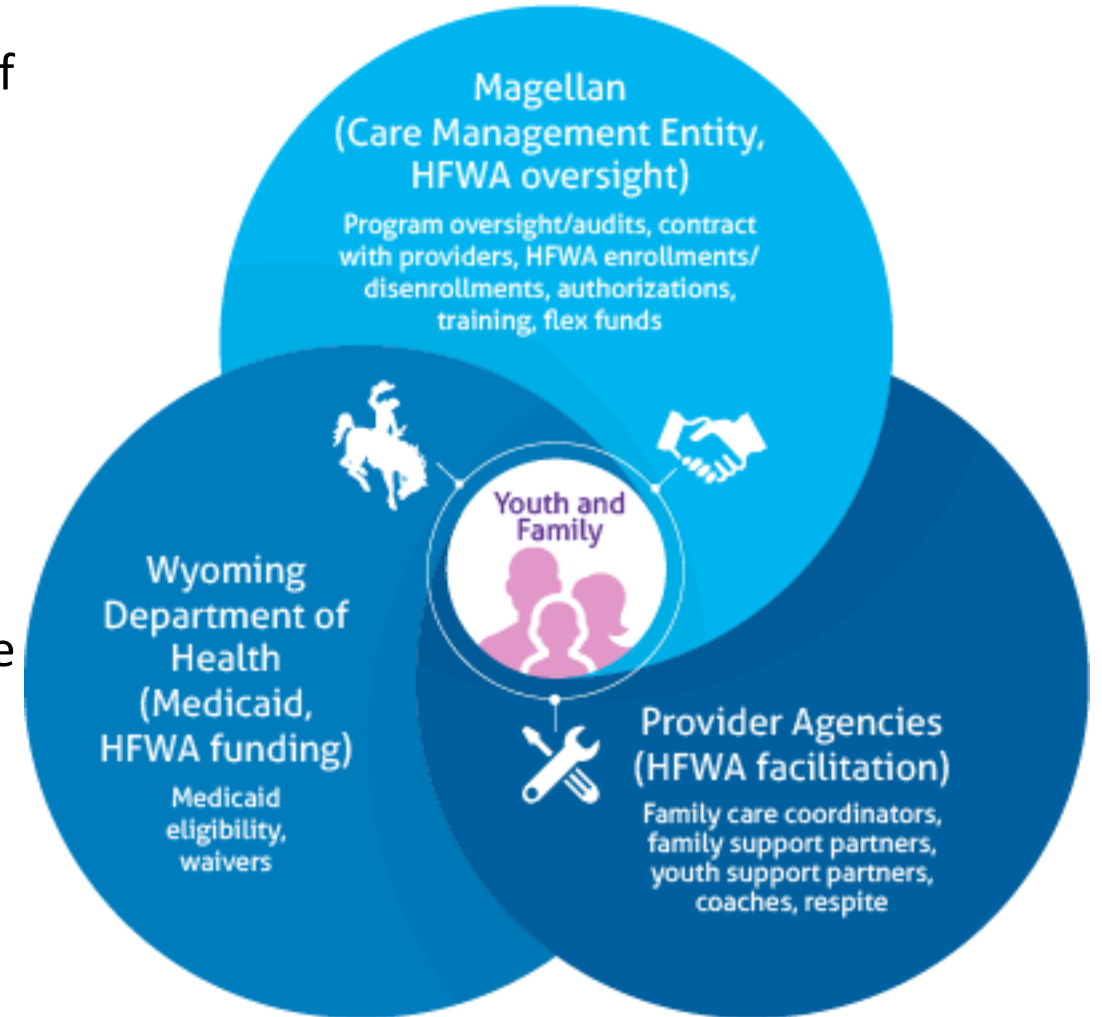


# Our Partnership and Care Management

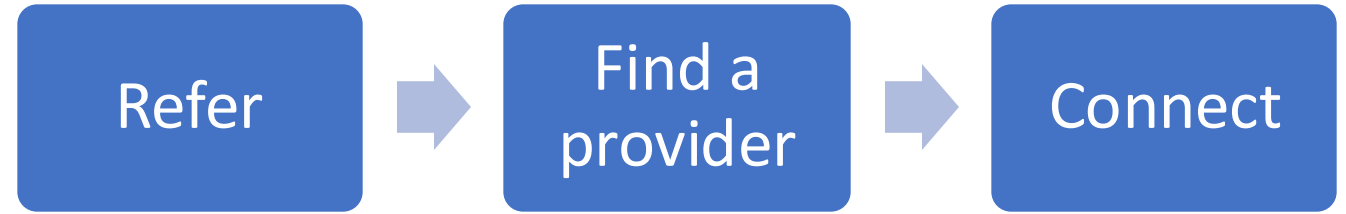
- We collaborate closely with the Wyoming Department of Health, Division of Healthcare Financing (Medicaid).
- Our goal is to coordinate care and create support teams using the High-Fidelity Wraparound model.
- We address the day-to-day challenges experienced by children, youth, and their families right where they live.

## Our Role

- Our local team at Magellan Healthcare, Inc. serves as the Care Management Entity.
- We are responsible for managing the High-Fidelity Wraparound program.
- This means we establish the program's guidelines and provide comprehensive training for all individuals involved in the High-Fidelity Wraparound process.

# Why we talk about “Clinical Needs” in a Non-Clinical coordination process

YOUTH WHO MEET CRITERIA FOR HFVA ENROLLMENT HAVE CLINICAL NEEDS PRESENT WHICH REQUIRE INTERVENTIONS AND TREATMENT WHICH ARE TYPICALLY PROVIDED BY QUALIFIED MENTAL HEALTH AND OTHER PROFESSIONAL CLINICIANS.

# High Fidelity Wraparound Cost Savings

## Quality of care

- 90%** of Caregivers are satisfied with the wraparound process\*
- 84%** of Caregivers are more confident about their ability to care for their child at home\*
- 90%** of Caregivers report that family has made progress toward meeting their needs\*



## Membership growth

 Youth served increased by 32%  
(2022 – 2024)

 Cost per youth decreased by 14%  
(2022 – 2024)



Membership growth increased while cost per youth decreased illustrating that Wraparound is financially sustainable while also improving outcomes for youth across Wyoming.



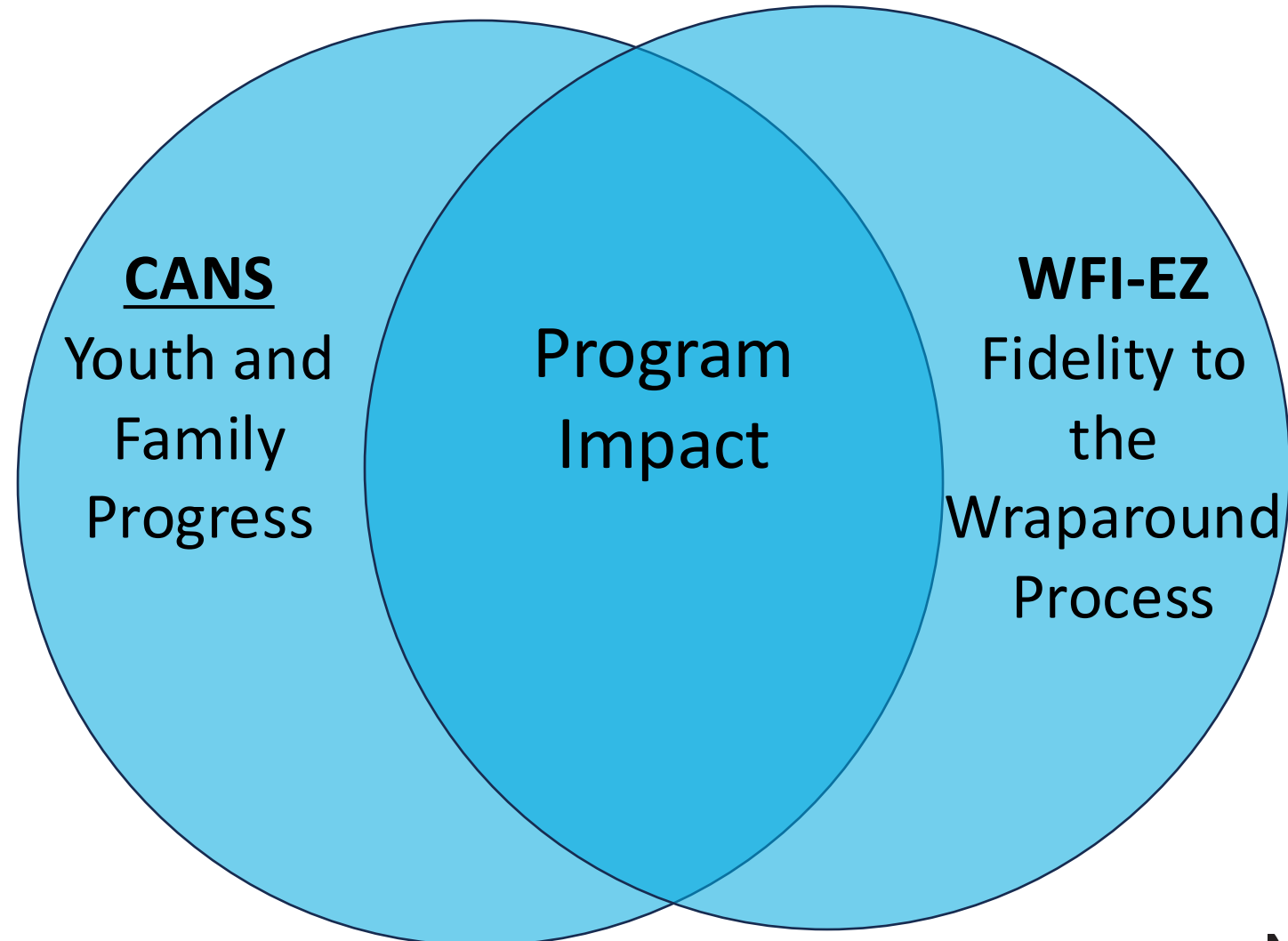

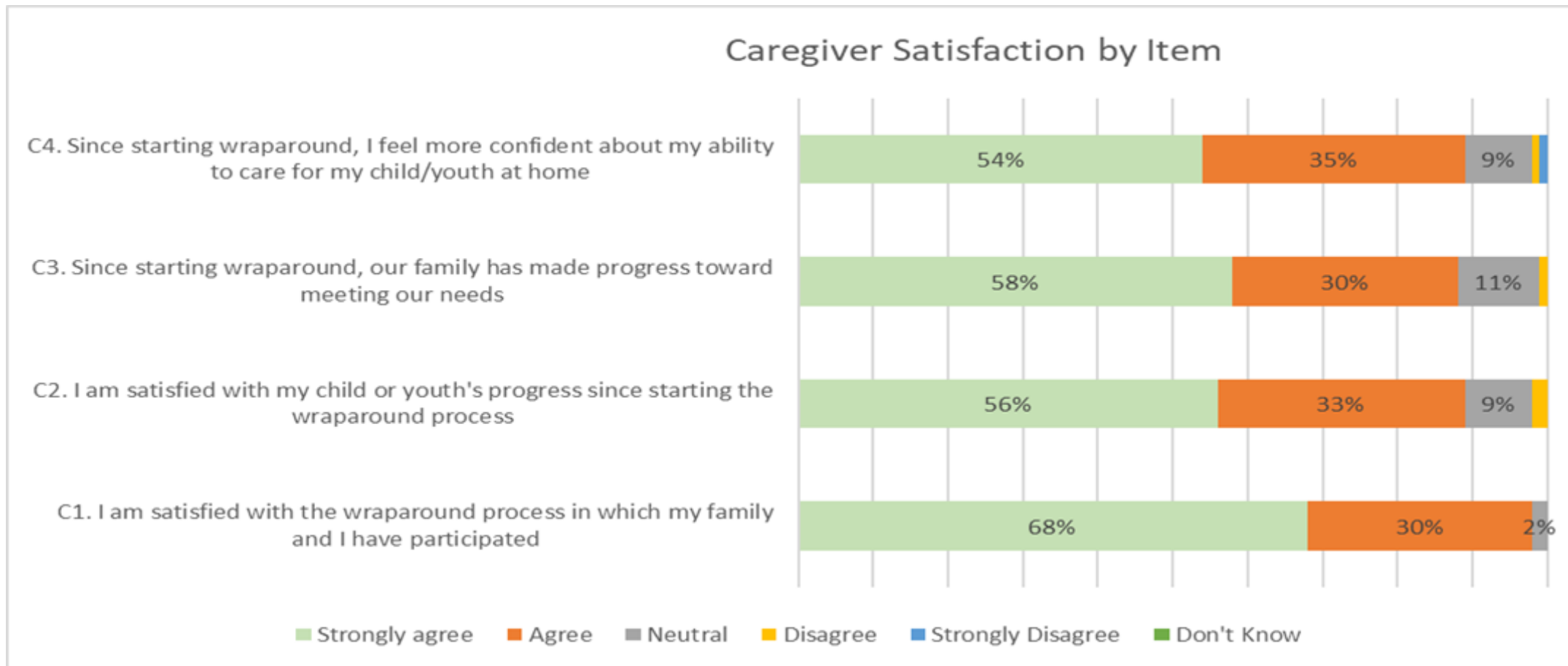

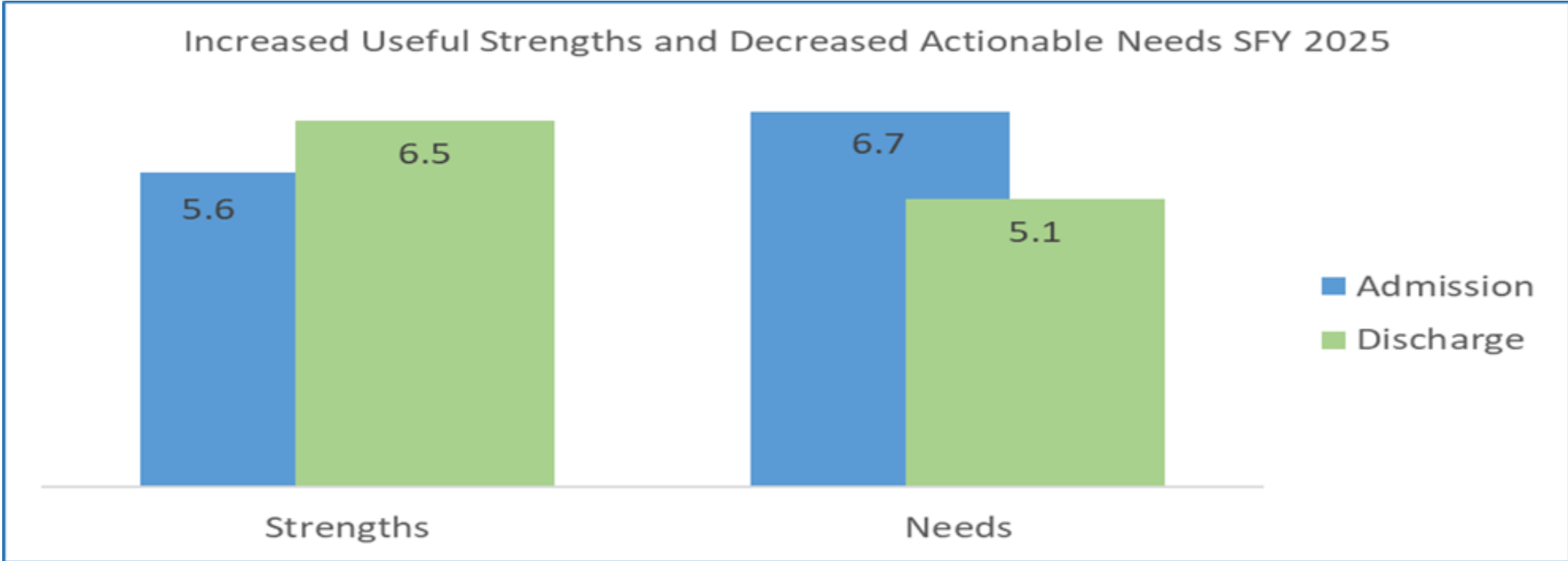

# Child and Adolescent Needs and Strengths Assessment (CANS)



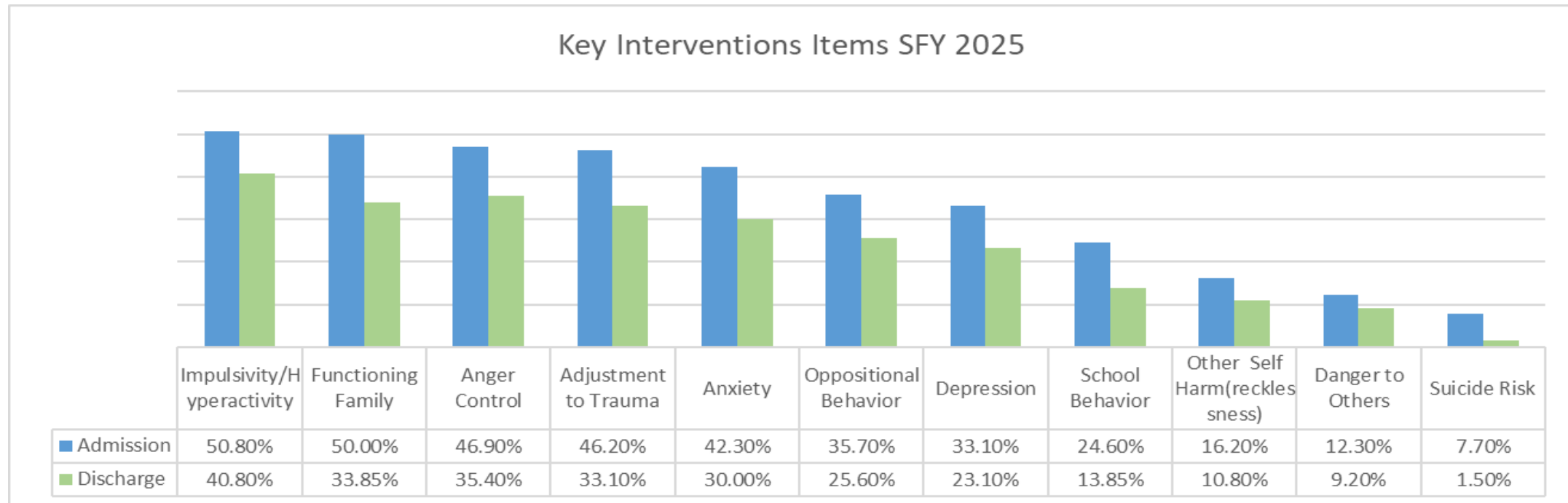
The CME uses the CANS data to identify areas of need for our youth as well as monitor the High Fidelity’s Wraparound Program’s effectiveness to support the enrolled youth and their families in resolving those needs.



# Child and Adolescent Needs and Strengths Assessment (CANS)



A Key Interventions view from Admission CANS and Discharge CANS with some of the most prevalent needs and highest change scores in Behavioral Emotional (Impulsivity/Hyperactivity, Depression, Anxiety, Oppositional Behavior, Adjustment to Trauma, Anger Control), Functioning (Functioning Family, School Behavior), and Risk (Suicide Risk, Danger to Others, Other Self Harm) summarizes the impact of HFWA on reduced severity in each high prevalence item.



# Your Community Serving Your Families



- Rooted in Your Community
  - Providers live and work in the communities as the families they serve
  - They have an understanding of the culture, values, needs, strengths, and realities of your area.
  - Keeps services close to home---families don't have to travel far or work with strangers
- Build Stronger, Connected Communities
  - HFWA brings together schools, mental health, faith groups, and community health organizations to support youth and families.
- Empowering Youth and Families
  - Focuses on family voice and choice --- families design their plans
  - Youth are active leaders of their goals
  - Builds confidence, self-advocacy, and hope
- Investing in Jobs and Economy
  - Wraparound creates jobs within the community
- Not One-Size-Fits-All

# Wraparound and DD Waiver



- Wraparound can support your families on the DD Waiver Waitlist while they wait for the funding.
- Collaborative Partnerships
  - Sending Referrals between the two waivers
  - Case Managers being part of teams
    - We encourage expectation and boundaries as you work together with the family to see what this looks like.
  - The Wraparound Plan can be a starting point for the DD Waiver Case Plan
  - Wraparound Providers should work with Casemanagers when a Youth needs to apply for other Waivers
- Magellan completes a 30 day transition in anticipation of DD Waiver Funding
