

CMS Provider Revalidation and NPI Mandate



Frequently Asked Questions (FAQ)

Q: Do I need to revalidate again if I just completed my revalidation?

A: No. If you recently completed your revalidation you will not need to complete it again immediately. Specific revalidation timelines are dependent on when a provider completed their last revalidation and a provider's identified risk-level. You will receive a 90-, 60-, and 30-day email notice from the provider message center when your next revalidation is due.

Q: Where do I go to complete my revalidation and Change of Circumstance (CoC)?

A: Providers should log in to the [DyP provider portal](#) to complete a revalidation or Change of Circumstance.

Q: Do I still need to complete a Change of Circumstance (CoC) if I added a National Provider Identifier (NPI) when I completed my revalidation?

A: No, but please contact the HCBS credentialing team at WDH-HCBS-Credentialing@wyo.gov to verify the NPI has been added to your Waiver provider file.

Q: After obtaining an NPI and submitting a Change of Circumstance (CoC) in the DyP provider portal, do I also have to submit a change request in the Wyoming Health Provider (WHP) portal?

A: No, you do not also need to submit a change request within WHP. To ease provider burden as it relates to compliance with this CMS mandate, the HCBS Credentialing team will be entering NPIs into the WHP on behalf of providers. However, for all other changes, the provider continues to be responsible for submitting a Change Request within WHP in addition to the CoC in the DyP provider portal.

Q: How do I obtain a National Provider Identifier (NPI)?

A: A provider can obtain an NPI by applying on the National Plan and Provider Enumeration System (NPPES) website at <https://nppes.cms.hhs.gov> or by mailing in a paper application. The application takes 15 to 20 minutes to fill out and is entirely free. Online applications are processed within 1 to 10 business days; paper applications take roughly 20 business days to process.

Q: What kind of National Provider Identifier (NPI) do I need?

A: Medicaid Enrollment requires that your NPI type matches your PRESM provider type. If you are enrolled with Medicaid as an individual provider type you will need to register for an Individual NPI (type 1). If you are enrolled with Medicaid as an agency provider type (group or facility enrollment) you will need to register for an Organization NPI (type 2). HHS will reject your CoC if the submitted NPI type does not align with your provider type.



Q: Do I need a National Provider Identifier (NPI) if I am a Case Manager on the Community Choices Waiver (CCW)?

A: The only case managers who need an NPI are those who are individually enrolled with Wyoming Medicaid. You do not need an NPI if you are a CCW Case Manager working under an enrolled Case Management Agency.

Q: What taxonomy do I pick when applying for a National Provider Identifier (NPI)?

A: You should pick the taxonomy that most closely describes your provider type, classification, or specialization from the [National Uniform Claim Committee](#) code set list. The taxonomy code selected for your NPI registration *does not* have to match your taxonomy within your Medicaid Enrollment, so don't worry if there is a mismatch. Some taxonomies that may be relevant to waiver providers are:
